The Referendum in Ireland

National Conference to discuss EU's future following the vote in Ireland

The citizens of the Republic of Ireland are today voting on whether their country should ratify or not the Treaty of Lisbon. This is the second time that the Irish have been asked to express their opinion on the Treaty signed in Lisbon on the 13th December 2007. Although, apart from Ireland, two other Member States still require to complete the ratification procedures, should the Yes vote prevail, the last obstacle would practically have been overcome for the necessary reforms and changes to the EU's legal personality and institutional make up, contained in the Treaty, to come into force. Should the outcome be negative, the EU will have the face the challenges that such a result will present and improvise alternative strategies for its future.

In order to discuss the future of the European Union in the light of the result of the Irish vote, MEUSAC is organising a National Conference on Friday, 9th October 2009 between 9.00 am and 1.30 pm at the Westin Dragonara Hotel in St. Julian's.

The Conference, entitled "Europe - After Ireland: What Next" will be officially opened with an address by the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs, Dr. Tonio Borg.

Professor Roderick Pace, Director of the European Documentation & Research Centre at the University of Malta will deliver an analysis of the vote in the Republic of Ireland.

He will be followed by the Ambassador of Sweden to Malta, Ms. Ulla Gudmundson. Sweden currently holds the presidency of the Council of the EU and Ambassador Gudmundson will be speaking about the views of the Government in Stockholm on the way forward.

Mr. Richard Crowe, Legal Adviser at the European Court of Auditors and Senior Fellow at the Centre for European Integration Studies (ZEI) of the University of Bonn will speak about the implications of the outcome of the referendum for the EU institutional framework.

Given that the Treaty of Lisbon, should it come into force, has important implications on the external relations' capacity of the EU, the new Ambassador of the United States to Malta, Prof. Douglas W. Kmiec, himself a jurist and expert in Constitutional Law, will be addressing the Conference about how the EU is perceived by Americans and on the role that the EU plays as a global actor.

The final part of the Conference will be a Panel Discussion on the future of the European Union after the vote in Ireland, particularly in terms of Enlargement of the EU, its External Relations as well as the enhanced role of the European and national Parliaments. The discussion, moderated by Fr. Joe Borg, will bring together the Heads of the 2 delegations to the European Parliament, Dr. Simon Busuttil and Mr. Louis Grech, members of the Foreign and European Affairs Committee of the House of Representatives, Dr. Francis Agius, Dr. Luciano Busuttil, and Dr. George Vella, the European Commission's Head of Representation in Malta Dr. Joanna Drake, as well as well-known journalist Mr. Noel Grima.

The Conference will be concluded by an address to be delivered by the Prime Minister of Malta, Dr. Lawrence Gonzi.

The Conference which will be held in Maltese and English (with facilities for simultaneous translation from Maltese into English) is open to the general public. However, registration is required. An email may be sent on info.meusac@gov.mt by not later than noon of 8 October 2009.

Ir-Referendum fl-Irlanda Konferenza Nazzjonali dwar il-futur tal-Ewropa wara l-vot fl-Irlanda

Iċ-ċittadini tar-Repubblika Irlandiża llum qegħdin jivvutaw dwar jekk pajjiżhom għandux jirratifika t-Trattat ta' Liżbona. Din hija t-tieni darba li l-Irlandiżi ġew mitluba jesprimu l-opinjoni tagħhom dwar it-trattat iffirmit f'Liżbona nhar it-13 ta' Diċembru 2007. Ghalkemm, barra mill-Irlanda, fadal żewġ Stati Membri oħra li għad iridu jagħlqu l-proċeduri tar-ratifika, jekk il-vot ikun pożittiv, prattikament l-aħħar ostaklu jkun ġie meġhlob biex jidhlu fis-seħħ ir-riformi u t-tibdiliet meħtieġa fil-qafas ġuridiku u istituzzjonali tal-UE li huma mniżżla fit-Trattat.
