MEUSAC CORE GROUP DISCUSSES EUROPEAN MARITIME TRANSPORT

The Core Group of the Malta-EU Steering and Action Committee (MEUSAC) met again today under the chairmanship of the Hon. Dr. Chris Said, Parliamentary Secretary for Public Dialogue and Information.

The main topic on the Agenda was the EU's Maritime Transport Policy in view of the Commission's recent proposals on:

- 1. Strategic goals and recommendations for the EU's maritime transport policy until 2018;**
- 2. A Communication and action plan with a view to establishing a European maritime transport space without barriers; and**
- 3. Reporting formalities for ships arriving in and/or departing from ports of the EU Member States.**

Following presentations by Mr Julian Micallef, Acting Head Consultation at MEUSAC, and by Mr Charles Abela, Deputy Executive Director (Ports) at the Malta Maritime Authority (MMA), various members raised a number of points in relation to these proposals.

The Communication on the strategic goals and recommendations for the EU's maritime transport policy is intended to address pressures from globalisation and competition in particular with regard to quality shipping relocating overseas, as well as to address economic and energy-related crises.

In relation to the Communication and action plan with regard to establishing a European maritime transport space without frontiers, much of the discussion centred on the need to enhance the reputation of the Maltese flag. Among the issues raised by Core Group members were:

- the repercussions of the Commission's communication on EU seafarers and port workers;
- passenger rights for users of ferry and cruise services,;
- better links between islands;
- the need to ensure a level playing field for Maltese manufacturers' competitiveness in particular with regard to maritime transport between Malta and the UK;
- the lack of border controls on merchandise imported on ferries; and
- a better synergy between local authorities with regard to imported goods.

Mr Charles Abela explained that the EU recognises the need for greater visibility within the International Maritime Organisation as well as the need to establish a maritime transport space without borders through simplified customs procedures. He re-assured Core Group members that consultations are currently being held in order to ascertain how port and pilot workers will be affected by the Communication, and that Malta Enterprise is conducting studies on transport between islands, including between Malta and the UK. Mr Abela said that the Communication is not pertinent to a discussion on flag registration issues.

Concluding the discussion, Parliamentary Secretary Dr. Said suggested that the maritime transport presentations delivered to the members of the Core Group should also be presented to members of the MCESD in view of the possible economic and social impact locally.

Civil Society Fund

Members of the Core Group discussed the Civil Society Fund which is aimed at offering financial support to constituted bodies and representative organisations for EU related activities. The discussion centred on whether the CSF should be retained in

its present form or transformed into a co-financing fund for EU projects, or be modified to have elements of both.

As a result of the discussion, it was agreed that bilateral meetings between MEUSAC and Core Group member organisations would be held and that a proposal would be drawn up that would take into consideration the views expressed.

Sectoral Committees

The Parliamentary Secretary, the Hon. Chris Said, informed Core Group members that the Sectoral Committees' secretaries have been recruited and that the Committees will be meeting between the 12th March and the 9th April. He also noted that by the next meeting of the Core Group, three NGO representatives will have been elected to represent the voluntary sector organisations on the Core Group.

Il-Komunikazzjoni fuq l-ghanijiet strateġiċi u r-rakkomandazzjonijiet għall-politika tat-trasport marittimu tal-UE hija maħsuba li tindirizza sfidi marbuta mal-globalizzazzjoni u l-kompetizzjoni rigward il-kwalità ta' vjaġġar bil-vapuri rilokati barra, kif ukoll biex tindirizza krizijiet marbuta mal-ekonomija u l-enerġija.

Dwar il-Komunikazzjoni u l-pjan ta' azzjoni bil-ħsieb li tiġi stabbilita zona Ewropea tat-trasport marittimu mingħajr fruntieri, il-membri tal-*Core Group* saħqu dwar il-ħtieġa li tittejjeb ir-reputazzjoni tal-bandiera Maltija. Diversi punti kienu mqanqla fosthom:

- ir-riperkussjonijiet tal-Komunikazzjoni tal-Kummissjoni fuq il-baħħara fl-UE u l-haddiema tal-portijiet;
- drittijiet tal-passigieri li jużaw il-vapur u l-*cruise liners*.
- tittejjeb fil-mezzi ta' trasport bejn il-gzejjer;
- il-ħtieġa li jkun hemm assigurazzjoni ta' livell ekwu tal-kompettività tal-manifatturi Maltin, partikolarment rigward it-trasport marittimu bejn Malta u r-Renju Unit;
- in-nuqqas ta' kontrolli mal-fruntieri fuq merkanzija impurtati fuq vapuri li ma jgorrux merkanzija; u
- sinerġija aħjar bejn l-awtoritajiet lokali dwar kontrolli tal-merkanzija

Is-Sur Charles Abela spjega li l-UE tirrikonoxxi l-bżonn ta' iktar viżibilità fi ħdan l-Organizzazzjoni Internazzjonali Marittima kif ukoll il-bżonn li tiġi stabbilita zona Ewropea tat-trasport marittimu mingħajr fruntieri permezz ta' proċeduri tad-dwana aktar simplifikati. Huwa assigura l-membri tal-*Core Group* li l-MMA qegħda twettaq serje ta' konsultazzjonijiet biex tistabbilixxi kif jistgħu jintlaqtu l-haddiema tal-port u dawk li jsuqu l-*pilot boats*, u qal li l-*Malta Enterprise* qegħda tagħmel studji dwar l-impatt tat-trasport bejn il-gzejjer, inkluż bejn Malta u r-Renju Unit. Is-Sur Abela qal li l-Komunikazzjoni għad-diskussjoni ma tirrelatax ma' kwistjonijiet dwar ir-reġistrazzjoni tal-vapuri.

Fi tmiem id-diskussjoni dwar il-Politika għat-Trasport Marittimu tal-UE, is-Segretarju Parlamentari, Dott. Said issuggerixxa li l-preżentazzjonijiet li ngħataw lill-membri tal-
